

Marlene Potter, a Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), is the Founder and Director of the Coconut Grove Center for Counseling. Ms. Potter holds two masters degrees from the State University of New York at Stony Brook. She believes that the biology of the brain influences people's emotions, behavior and interactions.

Marlene authored a book, *Emotional Hijacking*, published by Amazon which has been widely read and valued by both individuals and mental health practitioners. Earlier in her career, she pioneered the Turtle Technique, a method for teaching self-control to children with behavior problems. She published research articles and produced a film for teachers called, "Catch Then Being Good".
